1. Author guidelines typescript preparation

N.B. The previous issues may show formatting different to that which is requested here; if in doubt, please follow the instructions on this page.

- The original typescript should be submitted electronically in A4 size format, with 1.5-spaced typing preferred and a wide margin on the right.
- The size of a working paper is not limited, although we advise you to keep it within ‘standard’ limits (7,000-8,000 words).
- Two files should be included:

File 1. The title of the paper, plus the names, affiliation and complete addresses, e-mail and fax number of authors, and an abstract, keywords and brief biographical notes about the authors.

File 2. The text of the paper with the title, but without the names of authors and self-identificatory notes in the text.

- We accept papers in Russian or English. Please use American English. If English is not your first language, please ask an English-speaking colleague to proofread your paper.

International context

- It should not be assumed that the reader is familiar with specific national institutions or corporations. Authors are encouraged to approach their chosen topic from an international perspective.
- Countries and groupings of countries should be referred to by their full title (for example, 'China', 'Europe' and 'America' are all ambiguous).
- Special attention should be paid to identifying units of currency by nationality.
- Acronyms should be given in full when first mentioned.

Supplementary information (abstract, addresses, biographical notes)

Please assist us by following these guidelines:

- Abstract: approximately 100 words, maximum 150

- Address : position, department, name of institution, full postal address
- Biographical notes: approximately 100 words per author, maximum 150.

References and notes

- EDB Regional Integration Working Papers use the Harvard (name and date) short reference system for citations in the text with a detailed alphabetical list at the end of the paper. Citations in the text, for example: Smith (2002: 25); (see Smith and Muller 1999).

- Full reference should include all authors' names and initials, date of publication, title of paper, title of publication (*italics*), volume and issue number (of a journal), publisher and form (books, conference proceedings), page numbers. References, for example:

- Footnotes should be avoided, but any short, succinct notes making a specific point, may be placed in number order following the alphabetical list of references.

- References should be made only to works that are published, accepted for publication (not merely 'submitted'), or available through libraries or institutions. Any other source should be qualified by a note regarding availability.

Figures

- All illustrations, whether diagrams or photographs, are referred to as Figures. They should be black and white or in color, and numbered sequentially. It is possible to place them directly in the text.

Units of measurement

- Please use the international system for units of measurement.

2. Author Entitlement and copyright notice.

PDF files of accepted papers will be placed online at the EDB website. The author is free to disseminate the working paper. In addition, in some cases, we will produce a limited number of paper copies, which can also be sent to the author free of charge. Selected papers may be published in the Eurasian Integration Yearbook.

The author retains the copyright on her paper's content.
